Note that all prerequisite courses must have a minimum grade of C (2.0).

Admission to the Major

- Admission to this major is competitive, so your prior academic performance is important. Transfer students must have completed either a Direct Transfer Agreement (DTA) degree or 90 transferable credits by the end of the quarter prior to entry into the nursing program.
- Transfer students must have a minimum 3.5 GPA in the combined prerequisite courses, with no course less than a "C" grade (2.0). A maximum of two courses may be repeated to achieve the minimum grade of 2.0. Apply to Seattle Pacific University at the same time you apply to the nursing program and indicate nursing as your preferred major.
- Applicants must complete all prerequisite courses prior to beginning nursing major coursework.
- Part of the selection process requires applicants to participate in an interview. Applications for the nursing major are available on the School of Health Sciences nursing website:

Other requirements for the degree

In addition to the major, the degree requires completion of any remaining general education and University requirements, and at least 180 college credits total, including 60 upper-division (UD) credits.

All students must complete the University Foundations Requirement at SPU—even those who have completed the Direct Transfer Agreement (DTA) Associate Degree.

Students admitted with fewer than 90 credits (freshmen and sophomores) complete 15 credits:

Students admitted with 90 credits or more (juniors and seniors) complete 10 credits:
